are words that can replace nouns and noun phrases in a sentence



Three of the most common types:

- 1. Choose who will be X and who will be O.
- 2. Player One chooses a space on the board, reads the sentence aloud, and identifies the pronoun. If you answer correctly (your opponent agrees*), write your X or O over the spot. If you answer incorrectly, do not write your X or O over the spot.
- 3. Player 2 chooses a different space** and repeats the same process.
- 4. Alternate turns until one player gets three in a row or all the sentences have been played.

*Your teacher has an answer key if there are any disputes.
